## 2. Welcome and Adoption of Minutes of Previous Meeting

Chair and Members adopted the minutes of the fourth meeting of the Commission in May 2025.

Chair outlined that the first day of the Commission's exploration of transport would aim to provide an overview of the systemic changes required, existing commitments and future plans, and progress that has already been made in the transport sector in terms of a just transition. The Commission were to receive presentations from policymakers and relevant agencies. Academic contributions would then reflect on the concepts of liveable communities and transport poverty. Reflections on the finance outputs from the previous meeting were scheduled to be discussed.

The Department's name change was acknowledged.
